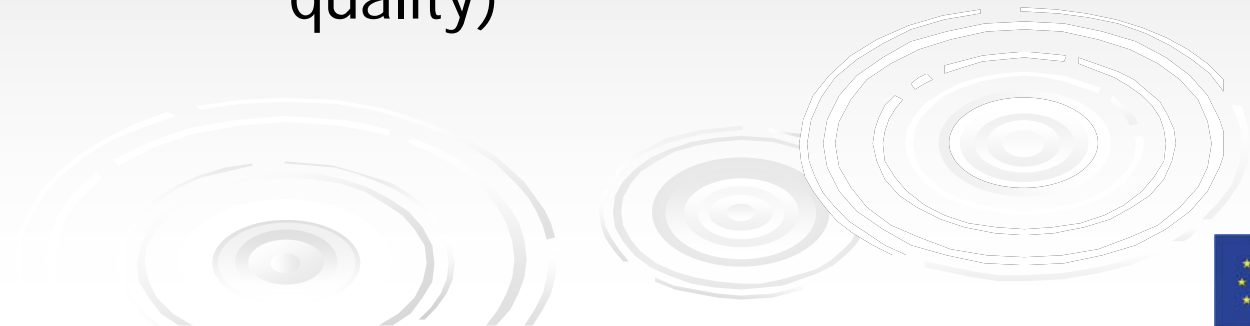
## OBJECTIVES

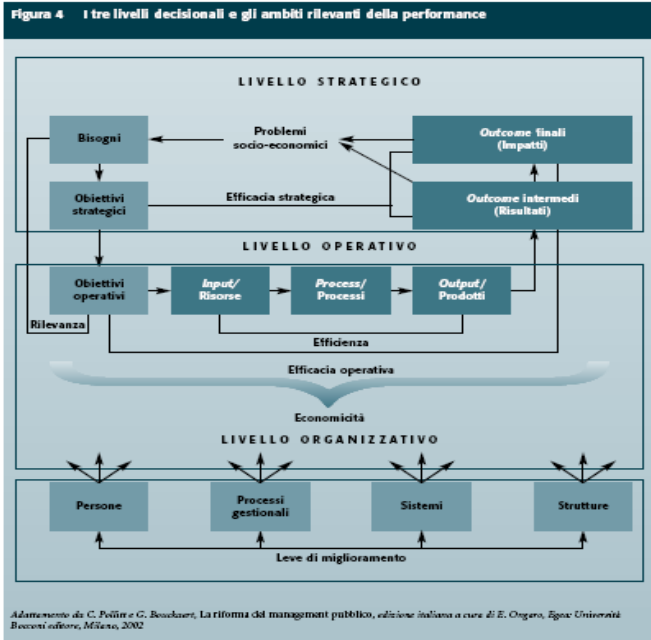

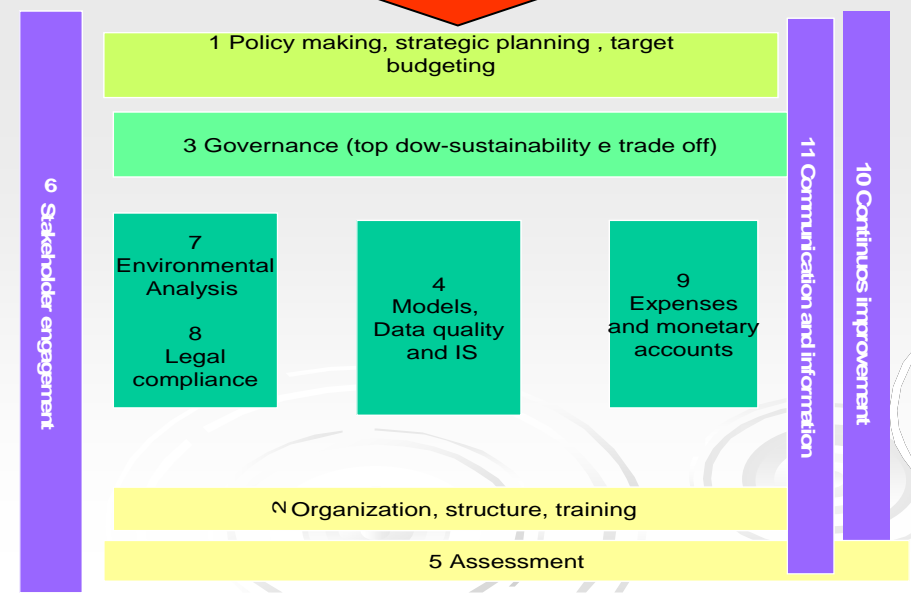
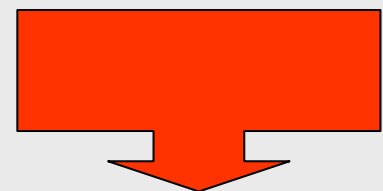

# Conceptual path

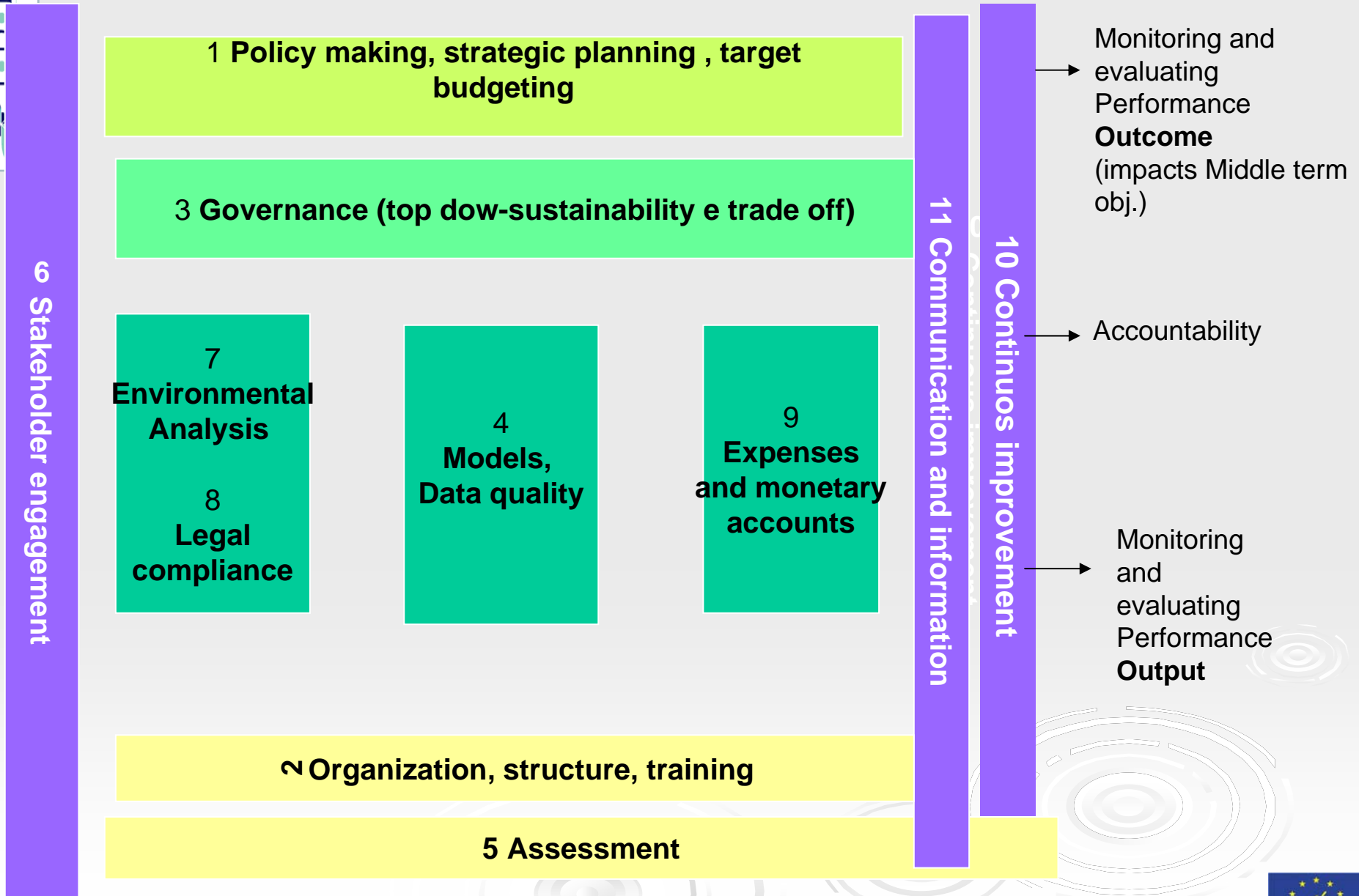


## The 11 Points

1. policy making and linkages with strategic planning	7. environmental initial analysis
2. organisational criteria and structure	8. legal compliance
3. participation (stakeholder engagement)	9. monetary accounts
	10. continuing improvement
	11. communication and information
<b>Specific</b>	
4. data quality and their operational assessment on the entire chain	
5. assessment	
6. entire chain and sustainability:

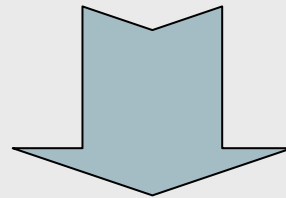

**Description on identified and proposed modalities to meet requirements** In each paragraph there are examples e recall to other points

### TO AVOID and BEST PRACTICES

**General things to do and to avoid (warning and best practices)**
